Once again thank you to you all and I hope this next twelve months will be as good as the last.




We must remember that without these successful events we would not be able to enjoy the excellent facilities we have at the field.

Points of interest from the last meeting

Extract of newsworthy items from the minutes of the last meeting. Note: Some events/activities may have concluded or been modified as circumstances change.

1. Wind Farm

Secretary checked WestWind web site: http://www.w-wind.com.au/ on 24th June. Site was updated on 11th June with the following note:

6 June 2009 – Our Buninyong staff have relocated to a <u>New Office</u> at Mt Helen. Contact details and maps are available on our <u>Office Locations</u> page.

2. ARF Scale Competition – 25th October 2009

- a) Matt Porter has put together the flyer/entry form and score sheet.
- b) Meeting agreed that we would adopt the F4C Scale flying rules which the VFSAA now uses given that they are similar, documented and will be what most scale flyers will be expecting.

- c) Trophies will be awarded along with spot prizes.
- d) Trophies will be made up from the wooden bases donated by John McLennan, the club logo and a small engraved plate. We have 10 club logos remaining, which is more than enough for this event. It will be necessary to get another batch cast.

Action: Secretary to forward F4C rules to Matt P. to enable flyer to be modified. (Done)

Action: Secretary to track down where metal logos were made and order another batch.

3. Field Maintenance

Max Rowan started the discussion off with the following points:

- a) Thought the seed we spread around after the grading would have germinated by now. Looks like it was past its use by date.
- b) Need to spray the matting with "roundup" to kill the fine grass that is growing through the matting. We do have some weed killer left over from when we sprayed the cape weed some months back.
- c) Need to define the flight line on the north/south runway.
- d) We have some matting left over that could be used to extend the pit area. Propose to discuss this at the field this Sunday.
- e) Sockets are needed for the model restraints along the pit area matting. Max said he will make some up out of scrap material.
- f) Follow up with Murri Anstis regarding the treated pine table/seats.

Action: Max to fabricate sockets for the "model restraints".

Action: Max to spray runway matting with weed killer.

4. Club Fees

Secretary advised the meeting that club fees for 2009/10 are due before the 1st July. Several members have taken advantage of the direct deposit.

5. Winter Meetings - Ballarat Golf Club

- a) Nick advised that the prospects don't look good at the Ballarat Golf club's new premises. They say that they don't really have a room suitable and the contact person is distancing herself from the positive offer made several months ago under the community obligation provisions of their gaming licence.
- b) The members that attend the meetings seem to be contented holding them at the field and our numbers have been better than when we held them at the table tennis centre in town.
- c) The meeting agreed that for the time being we continue to hold meetings at the field.

d) Nick demonstrated at the last meeting that we can show videos at the field using a laptop and his video projector attachment.

6. Xmas in July Night Out

- a) It was suggested at the last meeting that we hold a night out in July and that a suitable night would be the Friday after the AGM in July. A show of hands indicated considerable interest.
- b) Matt is to send out an email advising the members of the venue and date/time.

7. AGM 22nd July

VMAA News

- VMAA directory A new edition of the VMAA directory is about to be released. It will go to print after the July VMAA Executive meeting so that any changes to the executive can be included. Printing has been quoted at \$16,500 for 5000 copies. Advertising will offset the overall cost to the VMAA.
- VMAA Web Site The VMAA web site has a new look. Go to http://www.vmaa.com.au and check it out.
- **Purchase of State Field** A suggestion was put forward sometime ago for the VMAA to purchase the State Field from the MAAA. A set of Questions and Answers outlining the benefits to members is being formulated to present to clubs. The MAAA has advised a purchase price of \$253,666 + GST. (No doubt we will hear more about this in the near future.)
- **MAAA Council Conference** Some points from the conference held in May 2009.
 - o Heavy & Turbine procedure is making progress.
 - Assistance to a club to purchase land has increased from \$100,000 to \$200,000.
 - o MAAA purchased land has increased from \$250,000 to \$500,000
 - o Other loans have doubled.
 - o Future of Nationals status quo to remain.
 - Safety policy to be written up. Several new safety procedures will shake up a few club's safety regulations.
 - o MAAA field purchase sub-committee recommends that finance is sufficient, that all states are to apply for a second state field.
 - Next MAAA Council Rules conference to be held in 2013.
 - Next MAAA Council Meeting is to be held over 22nd/23rd May 2010 in South Australia.



New Models seen at field

Murri has added almost a 1kg of lead to the nose of his Tiger Moth following its test a couple of weeks ago. See last issue. We saw it take off and it has made a world of difference to the model.

It's a shame that you have to add that much lead to an ARF model when you fit the recommended equipment in the design locations. You wouldn't think the design could be that far out. Manufacturers need to pay closer attention to this extremely important detail.

Jeff Dowsley has repaired his Boomerang (see Crash Report of last issue). He has done a very good job of it – quite a practical repair and it is back in the air again ready for some more punishment.

Russell Aggett had a new P47 out at the field on Sunday 28^{th} June for a shake down.

The model is a P47 Thunderbolt from Model Tech. Wing span is 67", fuselage length 55.5" and is powered by a 91 four stroke.

First test flight was successful but the P47 was a bit erratic. On landing, the landing gear ended up splitting the blocks. It was back home and on the building board to fit the retracts to it.

Back out to the strip 2 weeks later it had a successful flight.

John McLennan brought his CM Pro Piper Cub out to the field on Sunday 12th July to show the members what building he is doing to meet his modeling needs after the boomerang. The Cub is quite a large model – must be well over 2m wing span. It is powered by a Magnum 91 FS which should give it very realistic performance. The U/C is sprung and looks to be quite well engineered. No doubt we will see it out at the field shortly for a test flight.

Russell Aggett also had his Great Planes P51 Mustang (old Crow) out on Sunday 12th July. The P51 is fitted with a 40-50cc petrol engine – can't remember the exact motor. There was a small problem with the elevator control which prevented the model from being flown on the day.

Crash Report

We think this is a first for our Yendon field. A mid-air collision! This happened on Sunday 28th June around midday. The two unfortunate models were Glenn's Me163 Komet and Allister Aggett's high wing trainer. Allister under the guidance of Murri had just taken off and was in his first circuit while Glenn was setting up for a landing and according to eye witnesses they hit almost head on resulting in the Komet loosing the left wing and fin. The impact cut the fuselage of the trainer in half behind the wing. The trainer plummeted to the ground while the Komet spiraled down with the motor still running. The flat spin prevented further serious damage when it hit the ground. The remaining debris took some time to come down and was scattered over a wide area.

Glenn is still considering whether to build a new wing and repair it or build a complete new airframe.

Max finally wrote off the small Lancair that he has been battling with for the last 12 months. While doing a tight 180 degree turn to line up on the runway the Lancair tip stalled and spiraled in causing significant damage. We don't think Max is interested in repairing it – he has never liked it. Too small, too heavy, too twitchy.

A Close Call.

On Thursday 16th July Len was flying the smaller of his two electric gliders when the nose dropped in a turn and wouldn't respond to the elevator. Straightening up picked the nose up then Len brought it back, controlling altitude with the throttle and landing it gently just off the strip. The plane is very lightly loaded and with virtually no wind it was easy – at least for the spectators!!

Examining it on the ground showed the elevator servo wasn't responding. A bit of jiggling showed it was an intermittent problem. Later Len isolated the problem to a dry solder joint holding two circuit boards together which had cracked, possibly from vibration in its previous service in a helicopter. Len has since resoldered the joints and returned the receiver to service.


