# Points of interest from the last meeting

# 1. Club Trainer

Glenn has got the club trainer flying successfully. If the engine is not reliable we may need to purchase something better. We can now see how successful the concept of a club trainer is.

### 2. Field Development

- a) We need to make the triangular section formed between the runways reasonably smooth for landing and takeoff without reverting to a Bowes Road style field.
- b) Glenn White is to organize the plumbing compliance certificate for the toilet and the other plumbing work.
- c) Rick Pimblott offered to do the painting and floor tiles in the toilet. He is to start this weekend.
- d) An underground cable has been run from the toilet to the clubhouse so as the generator can be housed under the toilet when we hold events. We must thank new member Rob

### 3. Raffle

The Secretary advised that a book of 10 raffle tickets has been sent out to all members with the last newsletter. 400 tickets have been printed so

far and 350 have been distributed. 200 more tickets will be printed before the display day.

# 4. Annual Display

### a) Advertising

i) Signs

The Secretary stated that he picked up a *Temporary Signage Application* form from the City of Ballarat Compliance Unit. There are 10 locations around Ballarat where temporary signs promoting events can be erected of which 3 must be banners. After some discussion the meeting decided to erect our 3 signs at:

- 1. Albert Street Sebastopol, 200m south of the 70km sign
- 2. Morshead Park, Sutton Street frontage
- 3. Creswick Road opposite the show grounds.

The 3 signs for 2 weeks will cost \$50 and can be erected on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> April.

It was also decided that we need at least another 6 road signs that can be set up at strategic locations on the day guiding people to the field.

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### ii) Radio

Graeme Allen is looking after the free advertising that we can get on the local radio stations. He is writing the spiel that will be put over the air.

### iii) Newspaper

Graeme Allen is also looking after the free advertising that we can get in the local papers.

### iv) Newsletter

It was noted that we should get the next newsletter out before the event so that members are fully informed.

### b) Trophies

The trophies will be a wooden wall plate with the club badge adhered to it. A separate gold engraving plate will be then be attached beneath the club badge. The engraved plate will be glued on, on the day when we are sure of the events. This way we only sacrifice the small engraving plate if the trophy cannot be awarded for some reason. ### c) Prizes

It was decided to spend \$100 on prizes. Murray Anstis at Top Gun Models has kindly offered to match it dollar for dollar. This gives us \$200 to spend on goody bags and lucky draw prizes for the pilots. The overall cost of trophies and prizes, should be met by the customary \$5 pilot entry fee.

# d) General

- Pat Fisken is running the barbecue, tea, coffee, cakes, while we will run the soft drink stand. It would be helpful if all members brought out some ice on the day so that we do not have to purchase crushed ice.
- ii) Max Rowan presented a plan showing how the field is to be set up and an estimate of the people required to run the event. 25 people are required to minimize the workload.
- iii) Murray Anstis is constructing some tables with seats using the framing timber in the shed. (As of writing, Murray has built 3 tables like the one we already have and they look pretty good)
- iv) We need to set the field up on the Saturday.
- v) Max has arranged for 7 chemical toilets of which one is for the disabled. These will be picked up on Saturday and have to be taken back on Monday empty. Max has also arranged the pump out. Our toilet will be locked on the day.

vi) Col Pinkerton has offered to man the PA system on the day. We are going to ask pilots to provide some info on their aircraft via the pilot entry form. This will make the commentary more interesting to the public.

### 5. Club Hats

It was decided to get some hats made up. Current cost is around \$12 for the hat with our badge sewn on. The final price will be in the vicinity of \$20. Numbers are yet to be determined.



# New Models seen at field

The club now has a new trainer. It is a white Hustler Mark II powered by a 40ASP. Model has a trike undercarriage which makes it easier to taxi and demonstrate take-offs to novice flyers. The purpose of the model is to enable prospective modelers to have a go at flying and hopefully wet their appetite. It is also available for use by club instructors to teach new members. Model flies very predictably and is easy to take-off and land. We have had our first success with Rob Beardall achieving his first take-off and landing. Landing posed a particular problem and it wasn't until his third attempt that he got things right. In the mean time the model took a bit of a hammering, but that's what it is for.

Rick Pimblott is now flying a blue 40 size low wing sports model. We are not sure of all the details but the model seems to fly very nicely.



# **Crash Report**

The only crash that we have heard of was when Glenn was unable to get the transmitter in time from Darryl (someone Glenn was teaching) whilst he was attempting a landing. The plane was in precarious situation (like on its back heading towards the ground fast). Unable to reach the elevator control soon enough, the model hit the ground hard and sustained major damage to the nose area. Gravity sucks!!



# Tips & Tricks

Nose wheel steering seems to cause problems with many modelers. The common problem is that excessive load is applied to the control servo in the event of a heavy landing. The load is also pronounced if the nose leg has positive castor (ie angled forward). To protect the servo and the linkage it is important to build in some form of shock absorption. Some shock absorption methods are:

- 1. Form a triangular bend in the pushrod.
- 2. Self centering springs on the pushrod to provide some lost motion.
- 3. Nyrods that will buckle under excess load. You need sufficient protruding from the outer case to enable the nyrod to bend.
