# Points of interest from the last meeting

Please note that, some of these events and activities will be completed by now or conditions may have changed.

### 1. Club Trainer

- a) Murray Anstis offered to cover the RCM trainer that he has in his shop.
- b) Glenn White will continue to use the trainer that he has now got going. It has the club's radio gear in it. We will then keep the one that Murray is covering as a back up.

### 2. OZKOSH

We have been advised by the organizer of last years' event, that it is not being run this year. I understand that it is something to do with a risk management policy. May be it involves public liability insurance.

## 3. Lethbridge Display

The club has been asked to put on a flying and static display at Lethbridge Airpark on Saturday and Sunday  $9^{th}$ &10<sup>th</sup> March. The display permit application has been sent off to the VMAA and we are awaiting the reply. Those that are prepared to attend are only going for one day. Max Rowan is to confirm the better day. (As of writing up the minutes we have received the display permit and Saturday has been confirmed as the better day).

## 4. Annual Display

The following points were made through general discussion.

- a) Rick Pimblott has photocopied the advertising flyer that Graeme Allen has designed.
- b) It was decided to distribute them four weeks prior to the event (around 21<sup>st</sup> March).
- c) Pat Fisken is doing the barbecue, cakes, tea and coffee. (M.R.)
- d) BRMFC will look after soft drink sales.
- e) Tea and coffee will be handled from the new servery in the site hut.
- f) Give some flyers to Pat Fisken to distribute to her charity group so as they can promote our event.
- g) The meeting thought that the flyer needed to be modified to make the message stand out more. Rick Pimblott agreed to make the changes.
- h) The Secretary passed the raffle master around the meeting for comment. Some minor changes were noted.
- i) Ultra lights are willing to fly in at around 11.00AM and fly out around 2.30PM. They have their own insurance. (M.R.)
- j) Need to borrow slasher again to cut the existing full size runway.
- k) Murray Anstis advised that the Haddon club is willing to put on a display of Old Timer models.
- Martin Tuddenham has agreed to bring out some control line models and put on a display. (M.R.)

- m) We are sending out personal invitations to a number of pilots around the state. We have a mailing list of about 70 pilots.
- n) Matt Billett, and Glen Orchard from Mildura have agreed to put on an aerobatics display. (M.R.)
- o) Display time is from 10.00AM to 3.30PM.
- p) Require several tents for a swap meet etc.
- q) Need a supply of aeromodelling introductory information.
- r) Max to arrange 6 standard and 1 disabled person chemical toilets.
- s) It was suggested that we run a stall at Wendourree Village and/or the Trash and Treasure Market to promote the event. This would be held 2 or 3 weeks prior to the day.

### 5. Field Development

- a) The large gas bottle (~40kg) requires retesting and filling. Max Rowan said that he can get it done for \$70.
- b) The gas bottle is then to be plumbed into the site hut and connected to an old stove top that Glenn White has been able to procure.
- c) Inside of the toilet requires painting and vinyl tiles laid on the floor.
- d) New benches are to be installed beneath the servery hatch and to accommodate the stovetop.
- e) A row of tyres is to be placed across the front of the pit area in line with the "bus shelter" to delineate the pits from the flight line. They will provide some protection to models in the pit area from an errant aircraft (or pilot). A central gap and around the ends will allow taxiing out.

# New Models seen at field

Glenn finished off the partly built Hustler that was for sale by Top Gun Models to see if it would be suitable for a club trainer. We are still looking for a suitable motor to replace the old worn out ASP 40 that Glenn had in his bottom drawer.

Graeme Allen arrived at the Roy Gladman competition with a new model. It was one of those Italian plastic models, which are very heavy. However it flew quite well with no vices. Greame was having some trouble with the nose wheel on landing (Maybe you're not supposed to land on the nose wheel).

Our Treasurer (not our treasure) Rick test flew his latest model a couple of weeks ago. It is an Extra 300

with a 62" wing span and powered by an OS90 2 stroke. This is the third time that this model has featured in this column. It was originally owned by Mike Faulkner then Graeme Waterhouse and now Rick. Aircraft flies smoothly and predictably like most ARF's. However, large models like this still need to be flown with respect.

Unfortunately we were outdone on the day but we brought our models home in one piece after a successful days flying. Unfortunately there were an unusually high number of crashes of one sort or another. We think that there were ten aircraft damaged. One of the crashes claimed two aircraft when they collided in mid air on the approach to the runway. The flight director then stopped all flying for 15 minutes while the wreckage was cleared and took the opportunity to address all the pilots about flight safety.

## **Indoor Models**

To the Ballarat Radio Model Flying Club.

As one who is directly involved in both indoor free flight rubber power and R/C electric model aircraft movement in Ballarat, I would like to clarify a statement that was made in the BRMFC newsletter of February 2002 that states that the Haddon Model Aero Club was to be running a new indoor rubber power and R/C electric venue at the Netball Centre at Norman Street, Wendouree.

I have to tell you that it is true that mainly indoor R/C electric flying is to be held at Norman Street, but that the Haddon Club itself has NO INVOLVEMENT in this whatsoever. I did the groundwork and began the fortnightly Fly Ins at the Eastwood Street Leisure Complex over 12 months ago, and have done this of my own volition and without any help except for my wife Marj .In more recent times, I could see that although Eastwood Street is an excellent indoor venue, it is only a single basketball court in size, and that Indoor R/C Electrics would need a bigger space. To this end, I approached Mr. Peter Eddy at the WIN Miner Dome about the possibility of flying Indoor R/C Model Aircraft at the netball centre in Norman Street, Wendouree.

He said that he would like to have a demonstration of what I was proposing, and in due course I went to Norman Street, and did the demo, which was very well received indeed. Mr. Eddy gave his consent to go ahead with organizing, and as of February 2002, I have not had the opportunity to go ahead with it.

At the first meeting of the Haddon Club for 2002, I told the members who were present about the availability and suitability of the Norman Street venue, and stated that it was not going to be possible for me to run Eastwood Street and Norman Street and attend to my domestic situations as well. Haddon Club member Chris Foley indicated that he was interested in the possibility of taking on the Norman Street venue, IN CONJUNCTION with, Eastwood Street, which will continue unchanged.

Chris is now beginning the business of taking over any arrangements regarding the Norman Street Netball Centre from me, and I wish him well with it. I think that it will be a very good venue for indoor R/C Electrics.
