Points of interest from the last meeting 1. Subscription Installments

The Secretary reminded the meeting about the subscription installment scheme that is running this year. Suggested that members take advantage of it now, as next year's fees will be due in a little over four months time. A few members have already made deposits.

2. Membership Participation Scheme

Rick Pimblott's membership participation scheme that was tabled at the last meeting and printed in the February 2004 newsletter was discussed at length.

The main points that came out of the discussion were:

- 1. Points are too high for committee positions.
- 2. Require a proportional points scheme – ie if you achieve 1/2 the points then you are only liable for $\frac{1}{2}$ the surcharge.
- The surcharge would apply to life members 3. but juniors would be exempt.
- The aim of the scheme is to encourage 4. members to participate in club activities. Those that don't wish too, wipe the slate clean by paying the surcharge.
- 5. Meeting voted on a \$25 surcharge.

- 6. Unanimous vote in favor of the system in principle.
- 7. Meeting agreed that the fee should be paid up front and member reimbursed at end of year if the required points are gained.
- Rick to review scheme and submit to editor 8. for publication in the next newsletter.

On Monday March 7, (Labor day holiday) Max had his new electric Cub. Once in the air it flew quite well. it appears that it needs a little bit of a breeze to hand

Roger at long last has his Cessna Cardinal finished and read to fly. Model is powered by a Magnum 80 four stroke. After some concern with vibration, wing mounting modifications were made and the model was flown on the following weekend which was the 29th February. This model is from an Italian kit and was won in a raffle at the Monty Tyrell Scale Rally at P&DARCS in March 2000. The Cardinal flies quite smoothly and handles windy conditions quite well. Virtually no control trim was required.

Another nice looking model seen at the field on Sunday 14th March was Hugh's Jodel Dauphin powered by an ASP 61 four stroke. Hugh had problems with the fuel filler and was unable to fuel model for an engine run. So as yet the model has not flown but hopefully we will see it in the air shortly.
