# New Models seen at field

On Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup> Fred Eggleston had a couple of new models at the field, both being electric powered.

#### Ripmax Wot 4 Foam E Mk 2

Sports electric powered model from designer Chris Foss capable of a wide speed range and has sports aerobatic ability – good for newer pilots

Fred recently maidened the model and found it great to fly and said it performed a bit like the 40 size Boomerang.

### **Kunai electric Warmliner from Great Planes**

Quite a spirited model suited to a variety of flight from fast passes to thermalling and slope soaring.

With Nick's assistance Fred recently slope soared the model at Red Rock near Colac.

11) Meeting location



Fred with his two new electric powered models on Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup>. The Kunai certainly looks as though it would be capable of flying quite fast depending on the motor, ESC and battery setup.

n the same day Secretary Jeff had a scratch built SE5A powered by an ASP/Magnum 61 four stroke but it didn't seem to have enough power to gather sufficient flying speed to enable a safe take off. Looks like it needs a 91 FS to be on the safe side and I believe that is what Jeff is doing or going to do.

Ready for take-off but unfortunately the 61 four stroke didn't have enough grunt to reach safe flying speed. There was a fairly stiff breeze from memory which the windsock shows.



Sometimes retreat to the pits and try again another day is the smartest option.

G lenn has got the building urge again and decided to get back into finishing off the Comper Mouse he started several years ago. I think we all understand how projects get started and somehow slip onto the backburner – I know I've got one or two. Glenn brought it out to the field on Sunday March 26<sup>th</sup> to show the members where he's up to and discuss some of the curly problems he is facing, particularly the retractable undercarriage and folding wings.

Ark Williams had a new and quite large foam model of a Cessna 170 at the field on Sunday April 23<sup>rd</sup>. This one features fairly large main wheels to assist ground handling should the grass on the runway be a bit long or thick. I saw it fly and it exhibits impressive performance, far in excess of its full size counterpart.

Mark has been kind enough to pass on some technical details about the model.

#### Flex Innovations Cessna 170.

Constructed from EPO foam with light ply and carbon fibre reinforcement.

It has a wingspan of 2204mm, 5 channel with flaps and the approx. flying weight with battery is 4.0kg.

Electric powered with 60 size motor, 80amp ESC and 16x6 propeller using 5000mAh 6S 60C Zippy Compact LiPo.

Flight time is  $4\frac{1}{2}$  minutes at full throttle and 10 minutes at just over  $\frac{1}{2}$  throttle.

Unlimited vertical climb but mild top speed at full throttle.

On the same day Mark was also flying his little Corsair Reno Racer. I am quite impressed how these foam models fly. This one certainly slips along and has excellent ground handling characteristics and impressive flight performance. It must also be said that Mark flies it well and leverages the models qualities. He has also supplied the technical details which follow.

### Roc Hobby (by FMS) Super Corsair F2G Reno Racer



Mark's Corsair Reno Racer which features flaps & retract undercarriage and a four blade propeller.

Also constructed from EPO foam with carbon fibre reinforcement.

Wingspan is 1100mm and approx. weight with battery 1.5kg.

Electric powered with Brushless 3648 700kV motor, 70 Amp ESC and 10.5 x 8 x 4 blade propeller.

Static thrust held stationary at full throttle 985 Watts at 68 amps using 3300mAh 4S 30C Turnigy LiPo.

Flight time 4 minutes at full throttle.  $6\frac{1}{2}$  minutes at just over  $\frac{1}{2}$  throttle.

Unlimited vertical climb and approx. 140kph top speed at full throttle.

6 channel radio with flaps and retracts.

# **Compound Fence**

### Kitchen Reno

Peter Weston has pretty much finished off the painting inside. The kitchen facilities work quite well now that it has been updated with new cupboards, wiring and painting. We can now plug the generator into the kitchen (like a caravan) to power the fridge, urn and interior lighting.

This YouTube video of two top pilots flying in what are considered mild conditions (~30mph winds) at what is probably the premiere site in the world will give you a better idea of what it's about.

Flying more than one plane in the circuit is known as a "furball" but is almost never done with full carbon models capable of +400mph; for reasons that will become obvious if you watch the video. Enjoy.

P.S. the world record was recently raised to 519mph (835kph) which is more than double the speeds in this video. Wind speed was about 100kph.
