## 1.17 State Field Reports (for 2017/18):-

#### Northern Flying Group

Three major self-funded projects were undertaken for the year.

- We erected a 550m fence parallel to the entry road allowing us to leave the main gates open during the day this not only stopped and adjusted animals from escaping it protects the roadway and our cars from the animals droppings. This also make entry to the field easier for Sig users and visitors. The project cost was \$5,500.00.
- Project 2 was the purchase of a kit style veranda enabling us to protect the south end of the cub room. The kit price was \$3,350.00 and is yet to be assembled. We hope to have it professionally installed by October 2018.
- Northern bought a defibrillator to remain in the clubroom. All members have access to this simple to operate life saving device. The units cost was \$3,000.00.

Other projects include:

- As always ongoing maintenance has kept the runways and pit area in top condition. Fertilizing and top dressing has kept the grass strip in a very health condition. The sprinkler system has had all the spray heads replaced ensuring flawless operation.
- All out tractors and mowing equipment has undergone a major service guaranteeing we have reliable equipment needed to keep field was in peak possible condition.
- Our weather station has been fine-tuned and works 24 / 7. Giving up to date weather on a smart Phone or as part of Northern web site, at the click of a button you can see exactly what the weather is doing. The site automatically updates every 10 minutes 14 hours a day.

#### **Field Usage**

While members continue to use the field 7 days a week we always welcome Visitors.

Up to 18 times the field has been utilized for certification of heavy model by VMAA members not associated with Northern.

Sig groups continue to take advantage of the facilities with 7 weekends being booked for various events. Whether it's a single day for a scale event, a weekend of racing or even a training session on IMAC. The runways combined with the club room facilities continue to please special interest groups.

#### Bairnsdale

State Field Eastern has struggled through a very dry spring and summer this year so apart from the watered Airstrip there is not much in the way of grass here. We have spent quite a bit on drainage this year to reduce the incidence of surface water after rain also to prevent the pit and airstrip mats from becoming coated in slippery moss under the same conditions. We were privileged to have a number of rolls of artificial tennis court grass to help enhance the taxiways and pit shelter. Finances are quite depleted at present so we have had to slow down further development. We would like to extend the sun shelter, if the VMAA or MAAA would like to assist materials to double the size of existing run to around \$3000.

We expect the VPA to run their event here in October and we are operating an-ongoing arrangement with VJAA and likeminded people to fly turbine powered aircraft here on a regular basis at least during the non-fire danger months. Two visits have been successful to date and further are planned. We have the space and the long airstrip so it will become a more regular event as more modellers see the advantages.

As always we encourage groups to make use of our and your facility, so talk to us all we ask is a small donation to help cover club costs. Some accommodation is available on site with that comes hot shower, toilets of course and by arrangement water boiling equipment etc.

The club was also successful in gaining assistance from the MAAA for \$5500 which the club used to purchase a new zero turn mower. Total cost was \$6500. The highlight of the year was the clubhouse opening and fun fly in May 2018 which was a great success and enjoyed by all who attended.

#### Activities

The clubs regular flying day is Sunday with an average attendance of 10-15 pilots each week. There is also a lot of ad-hoc flying conducted by various members on various other days during the week. During the year the SAM 600 Old Timers held 2 events, the Vic Scale boys held an event and the Vic Pattern association also held one event.

The club really enjoys and embraces attendance by all visitors and SIG's

#### Membership

The club had an increase in junior membership this year which was pleasing. Currently we have 30 Senior, 5 Junior and 3 Social members.

#### Projects

This coming year the club is planning to add a shower facility to the toilet block and an extension to our pit / shade

covered area which will require financial assistance from the VMAA. These improvements will be of great assistance when running events and a more enjoyable experience for our visitors. We are also planning to add rock to our drive way/car park and continue with the beautification of our entrance with the removal of some old stock yards and more tree planting which will be financed by the club as time and resources permit.

**FEB**-New runway earth works have not yet been started due to site availability. They are due to commence soon. A temporary runway is in use with no problems Membership in the club (BMMAA) growing steadily with a further 2 new members last month.

Earthworks are due to commence end of February and Runway sow about early April.

Currently getting power connected in readiness for the watering required when the runway is sown, bore and pump are already completed. Funding is being discussed and will be formalized at the March meeting

Quotes for toilet block and clubhouse are being sought and will be tabled at a later date.

**APRIL**- Mains power is being connected and the Earthworks for the runway are underway, signage is getting organized but field is closed until earthworks are completed, more details in April when works are expected to be completed.

A full update will be given at the May meeting. The field at this stage is still closed but should be open very soon. Contact the Bacchus Marsh club for details.

**May**- Earthworks have now been completed and runway has been top dressed and seeded. Club has applied for a MAAA grant for rainwater tanks. Field is back in operation again, contact the club for more details. A field lease between the VMAA and the BMMAA will be drawn up and tabled at the June Meeting for approval.

**June**- Power has been connected, seeding of pit area and runway, has all been completed. The field is open for flying on the temporary runway. The \$43kbudget has been spent and the master plan for further development will be tabled for discussion at the July meeting.

**July**- All full club members will be viewing the field progress on 22 July, the newly graded and seeded runway is starting to show signs of growth and the Dam is almost half full, which is a pleasing result. Membership at this stage is 20 but numbers should increase by the end of the month. Club has received a \$2500 grant from the MAAA to go towards the water storage tanks. A strategic plan will be presented at the August meeting for review by the committee. Discussion for future planning will follow.



## Goin's on at the Field

### Engine Start-up Stands

The acquisition of three start-up stands was approved at the July meeting with Alan Crisp volunteering to construct following a similar design to that used at the Lilydale club.

Alan didn't waste any time and by Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> August the three stands were sitting proudly at the field. Everyone who saw them agreed Alan has done a great job. He sourced treated pine timber at a good price and fabricated the three for \$235.

Peter Evans also tried out the new stands with his Cub. You need to be very careful, particularly with large models, lifting off the stand with the engine running. Lift from behind to make sure you don't get tangled up with the prop.

### Kitchen Tap Pressure Pump

We've always suffered from little water flow from the kitchen tap even so back at Yendon. Then when the longer neck tap was fitted so the kettle would fit under it exacerbated the problem even.

First thoughts were to put a header tank up on the roof of the adjacent container to increase the head and thus water pressure. That was going to be a sizable job and tanks are fairly expensive as well. It would also need anchoring on the roof so as not to blow off in the wind if empty. A pump would also be needed to pump up to the tank as well.

It was then decided to install a caravan style 12V automatic pressure pump instead of the tank. This was purchased online from <u>Caravansplus.com.au</u> and initially fitted on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> August. The options were to fit it underneath the kitchen floor tapping into the inlet poly pipe or inside the kitchen under the sink. The latter being a far simpler option, it was installed under the sink hooking in via the flexible hoses.

The following weekend (12<sup>th</sup> August) it was wired in connecting to the battery in the charging station with an isolation switch incorporating a fuse and LED bezel to indicate when the pump is powered.



This is the battery we purchased for the solar powered charging system. It was recommended as a more suitable type over a conventional car battery for our needs.

If the isolation switch is NOT turned on water will NOT flow from the tap. With the switch on, when the tap knob is turned on the pump starts providing a good supply of water and cuts out when the tap is closed. It makes very little noise or vibration. All up cost including the pump, plumbing and wiring came in at \$203.85.

Power comes from switch though a hole drilled in the cupboard down the back to the pump.



Pump sitting underneath the sink plumbed into the tap supply hoses. Round plugs were crimped onto the pump wiring and sockets crimped onto the supply lead. This facilitates removal of the pump or connecting to another battery if the solar system fails for some unlikely reason.



Isolation switch, red LED bezel and fuse. It was decided to place near the gas shutoff so it would be less likely to get left on when shutting up for the day. Most members are accustomed to turning the gas off so should see the pump switch.



A 14mm hole was drilled through the cupboard base and through the kitchen floor to take the protective conduit for the 15A wire to the solar system battery supply.

## Toilet water pipe repair

Max replaced the burst copper pipe supplying the toilet taps on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> August. Let's hope the freezing cold nights don't cause any more trouble.
