Goin's on at the Field

Covering the Model Assembly Tables

The Model assembly tables were starting to look a bit sad and in need of some TLC. We've discussed covering them in the past and even canvassed the idea of using the ex-tennis court material the Bairnsdale club had on offer.

A couple of weeks back it was decided to use outdoor carpet like used in boats. Alan (Al supremo – that works well!!!) said it comes in 2m wide lengths so to do the three tables he ordered 7 metres.

Alan and I (Roger) arranged to go out on Saturday morning 7th December to do the work rather than tying up Sunday which was a good flying weather forecast. Peter Weston arrived shortly after us to mow the field if needed, but given that wasn't necessary lent a hand with the covering.

Alan being an upholsterer by trade was in his element so after doing a bit of patch work on the tables to fix a few broken and loose boards he was into wrapping the carpet over the tables and stapling underneath.



The first table went well but the second needed a bit of timber work done first to make sure all the boards were secure.



Getting old staples out and patching some broken/rotten boards.



The first table (which was in the compound) came up really well. We had to cut two flats on opposing sides of the round table so there was enough material to wrap underneath.



The middle table required screwing down to the stumps as well as patching some rotten boards.



Alan had his pneumatic staple gun to secure the carpet underneath then trimmed off the excess. The carpet will also help to hold them together.



It wasn't long before we had the three tables covered taking about 2½ hours all up.

They have come up really well and are a big improvement on what we had. You can now put small items such as screws on them without the risk of falling between the gaps in the boards. The carpet also works well with hook & loop tape such as Velcro to secure models from rolling off if a bit windy.

Just make sure models are defueled and not dripping oil to help keep them as clean as possible.

Electric Fence

On Sunday December 21st we took down the electric fence and stored it away in the old container. Several new and hopefully better insulator guides will be needed before it goes again, so that is a job we need to investigate sooner rather than later. Some sort of pulley arrangement is needed on the corners to prevent the wire cutting the plastic pin. If a metal pin is used it will simply fray the wire cable rendering it useless.

As the posts were removed the yellow plough discs were place over the holes to make sure they can be located next time it goes up.



The field is all clear now the fence has been packed away. The paddock is certainly drying out now even after all the rain we had over winter.





Alan mowing along the fence line to help mark the boundary in case contractors come in to crop the paddock. Maybe that is not happening this year given that it doesn't look a good yield with stock feeding off it all year. During previous years cropping had already been done by now.
