A completion date in the New Year will be discussed at the November meeting. This is a large undertaking and the committee thanks lan for his work so far.

New Models seen at field

Tips & Tricks *Tygon Fuel tube in Methanol*



Apparently when I (Roger) fitted the fuel tank in my Great Planes Super Stearman back in late 2007 I used a length of Tygon fuel tubing as

the fill/drain line. From memory it had the perfect curve to reach the bottom being rolled up in the packet and is fairly stiff. Now that I'm migrating all my models to 2.4GHz it necessitated removing the tank because the 36MHz receiver was fitted above it along with the battery pack. Seeing as the tank was out it was a good time to check it over and replace the fuel lines. I took the rubber stopper out and that was also showing signs of deterioration so replaced it as well.



The yellow Tygon fuel (which is for petrol) went rock hard after being in methanol/nitro for 9 years.

Getting back to the Tygon fill/drain tube it was rock hard – must be Tygon Viagra!!! To get it off the aluminium tube required grinding one side of the Tygon so it would release its grip. It was still quite serviceable though having gone hard rather than soft and would have continued to function as it had for the past 9 years. This time I bent the aluminium tube at a 45° angle and fitted a short length of silicone tube to reach the bottom.

Interestingly Tygon tubing which is a brand name is used in a wide variety of applications including food & beverage, medical & pharmaceutical. See this Wikipedia article https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Tygon tubing On the continued migration to 2.4GHz, I bought a couple more Hitec Optima 9 receivers one of which was fitted in the Stearman. When it came to mounting the two BODA aerials I found they were loose in the rubber mount which meant the aerials could have slipped out and not maintained the 90° relationship. How to easily fix it was on my mind. At the time I was wrapping light fishing line through the servo/battery leads and around the receiver to ensure they can't come out when it dawned on me a strand of fishing line through the rubber mount to increase interference might work and it did perfectly. Simplicity at its best. I use three loops of fishing line to secure all fixed extension lead plugs, it's cheap and easy to fit & remove. Tape is no good because it can come off in hot weather and leaves a messy residue.



Fishing line looped three times around the receiver and plug leads prevents them from pulling out.



A short length of fishing line provided sufficient interference to prevent the BODA aerials sliding out of the rubber mount. Don't know why they were loose on these two receivers, they weren't on the previous two – must be the weather.

And to top off the 2.4GHz migration the 4 cell 1100mAh NiCad battery pack was replaced with a 5 cell 2.5Ah eneloop X series pack.

Ps. The Stearman was flown last Sunday 21st November with the new gear not having flown since November 2014.



Gary Sunderland

It was with great sadness we learned on Thursday 3rd November of the passing of Gary Sunderland at the Bacchus Marsh Club flying field at Parwan earlier on that day. From what we have gathered he went out to the field and had one of his models assembled ready to fly and was later found by a Bacchus Marsh club member lying near it having collapsed from a heart attack.

Gary was a regular at the Nationals competing in the R/C scale events as well as free flight. He also regularly attended the Wagga Wagga WW2 & Military competition, VFSAA scale events held far and wide flying his scratch built WW1 models – like the full size many of them were challenging to fly but they were his passion. Gary also attended our open days at Yendon and was there at our last event held on 30th March 2014.



Gary's Bristol Box Kite was awarded best scratch built model. The Box Kite was the first military aircraft to fly in Australia at Pt Cook on 1st March 1914.

His funeral was held at the Bacchus Marsh Gliding Clubhouse at 2PM on Friday 11th November and attended by probably many more people than anticipated as the venue was bursting at the seams. BRMFC was represented by Graeme Allen, Glenn White, Noel Findlay and yours truly Roger Carrigg. The aeromodelling community and the Bacchus Marsh Gliding Club members were there in large numbers to pay their respects to Gary and his family in their time of sorrow.

Eulogies were presented by Gary's two daughters where we all learned a lot about Gary's life from a wider perspective than just aeromodelling. But from what they said, aviation was his passion all his life and he passed away doing what he loved.

Eulogies were then given by a member of the gliding club on his gliding activities, John Lamont then spoke on Gary's aeromodelling career, followed by a history of his writing life by a lifelong friend.

After the service Gary was laid to rest at the Maddingley Cemetery which was attended by family & close friends, while most others took the opportunity to look over the MOBA Glider Gary designed and built some 40 odd years ago. Gary's family have donated the MOBA to the Australian Gliding Museum at the Bacchus Marsh airfield, which was brought out of the hangar and put on display.

Graeme has the new cupboards in flat pack at home ready to assemble. It all came from Laminex along with the ceiling lining board for a really good price just before he officially retired from Laminex at the end of October.
