Points of interest from the last meeting

Extract of newsworthy items from the minutes of the last meeting. Note: Some events/activities may have concluded or been modified as circumstances change.

8) General Business

a) Trawalla Estate Update

No contact with any of the parties.

b) City of Ballarat Update

Narrowed down to 2 sites. City is holding meetings, but no response to requests for call backs.

c) Strategic Plan Development

Peter reported that he is heavily involved in developing an Australia-wide schools programme for drones, and can't afford the time.

Peter will forward his material he has developed to date and the task will be taken up by G. Allen, as the development of a Strategic Plan to address membership issues is too important to lose.

d) Field Maintenance

i) Murri Anstis reported the Burrumbeet airstrip is too rough to mow even a circle for rotary wing models.

Mount Wallace Proposed Land Purchase (BMMAA)-

JULY – The Bacchus Marsh club has addressed most of the issues, council approval has been sought, town planning checked and tacit approval received. Full submission to go to the MAAA in August 2016.

AUGUST – Contract of sale has been drawn up with special conditions as required by the MAAA. A Notice of site development has been erected and council has given its planning approval subject to any objections that may be raised. Greg Lepp on behalf of the VMAA has viewed the property and was impressed with its suitability.

Goin's on at the field

The big wet

It has been pretty wet throughout most of September and put the field under a bit of stress water wise but overall it has stood up quite well. The runways being on higher ground have not collected any water with the exception of the western end of the east/west strip. It is just as well we moved the pits when we re-established the east/west runway because that area has been under water and generally sodden for a few weeks now. Fortunately moving the pits for runway safety clearance shifted it to higher ground. 148mm of rain has been recorded at Ballarat Airport for the month of September (as of 26th September). The average for September is only 71mm. We didn't get any heavy rain – just continual light/medium rain over a couple of weeks.



Murri Anstis took these shots on Wednesday September 14th which convey the effect of the prolonged rain. This one was taken standing on the toilet stairs.



This one was taken from the southern side of the facilities looking over the e/w runway which is clearly under a layer of water as is the area between the facilities and the pits.

The front of the kitchen/containers being the low point has collected a bit of water and remained wet underfoot but fortunately seems to drain away once the rain stops.

While it's wet be careful where you drive so as not to tear up the ground particularly in the area between the pits and kitchen. The car park and gate entrance seems to be handling the wet but still requires everyone to take it easy to avoid skidding the wheels. Thinking back on it we had more of a problem at Yendon with the long entrance track that flooded after prolonged rain fall and stayed wet until the summer months arrived.



The Burrumbeet Racecourse field was also inundated with water. The actual location of the N/S runway is in the background and I would say just above the waterline. Photo was taken from the road on September 18th.

Electric Fence

The club was notified soon after the last meeting by the Trawalla Estate property manager that they will be running cattle on the paddock that we occupy. Flying fields can coexist with sheep but not cattle. As you know they leave huge deposits on the strip and their hooves wreak havoc on the runway surface particularly in the wet season.

The committee quickly organized a working bee on Saturday September 10th to install an electric fence around the area we occupy. Maybe in the future a second wire could be strung to keep the sheep out as well. Currently the fence is fixed but we are working on being able to lay down sections of it if the need arises. I and a few others have flown with the fence in place over the last few weekends and it doesn't pose any major problems but might have a psychological effect on many pilots.

Interestingly though, we haven't seen the cattle in the paddock since the fence was erected. It seemed strange that the cattle would be in with the crop. Maybe the wet weather has changed their farming practices.



It is hard to see in the photo but there is now an electric fence around the field perimeter. Photo was taken on September 11th, the day after it was erected.

When the fence was first erected it ran across the back of the car park to the toilet as a quick means of keeping the cattle out of our field area. This meant it needed to be turned off and laid down to get in. On Sunday September 18th Murri and I (Roger) rerouted it so that it runs up to the road fence on the south side and across to the big shed on the north side. Now it doesn't need to be turned off unless special needs arise.



Once again hard to see the fence in the photo, but it now goes across to the road fence instead of behind where the cars are parked.

The insulated connectors enable it to be unhooked from the road fence if vehicle access is required into the main paddock.



2016 FAI F4 World Championships for Scale Model Aircraft – Ploiesti (Romania)

The world championships for scale model aircraft were held in Ploiesti Romania from August 20th to 28th.

Club member Noel Findlay together with Noel Whitehead and David Law from Melbourne competed once again as they did in France two years ago.

They used the same tried and proven aircraft as last time. Noel F. – DH Fox Moth, Noel W. – PAC CT/4 & David – Pitts S-2A.



Another MAAA member Anthony Ogle from NSW was also in the team and competed in the F4H class which has a lesser requirement as far as the building side is concerned. (At least that's what I think the difference is.)

It's hard to get any documented information on the overall results but from what I have picked up on the grapevine, David Law came 5th, Noel Findlay 7th & Noel Whitehead 15th in F4C while Anthony Ogle came 11th in his class.

The Australian team came 2nd in the team award.

Let's congratulate them on a magnificent result representing Australia on the world stage.



Lal Lal Wind Farm

Still being on WestWind Energy's information distribution list, I received their Update No. 9 – August 2016 newsletter on the 14th September.

It's of no consequence to us as a club now, but members may be interested to know what is going on so I pick out any info relevant to the Lal Lal wind farm and include it in the newsletter.

What are the changes sought by the planning amendment?

Since the project was approved, advances in technology have made wind turbines more efficient. For the Lal Lal wind farm, this means that more clean energy can be generated and exported, whilst also reducing the total number of turbines required on site. Some of the changes included in the amendment application lodged in August 2016 are listed below:

- Reduce permitted wind turbines from 64 to 60;
- Apply a newer and more accurate noise standard;
- Increase wind turbine maximum tip-height from 130m to 161m;
- Replace the rotor diameter and hub height restrictions to allow a maximum tip height of 161m with a limit of 20m above ground for the lowest point of the sweep of the rotor;

- Locate wind turbine transformers next to the towers;
- Increase generation capacity per tower from 150MW to 216MW.
- Annual payments to Moorabool Shire up from \$228k to approx. \$300k. (Commence once connected to the grid)
- No of households powered up from 63000 to 95000.

Tips & Tricks

I (Roger) had planned on taking my 1976 built P39 Airacobra down to P&DARCS to have a fly with Norm Morrish and his 1972 Northerner pattern aerobatic model the day after their club's 50th birthday dinner held at the Dandenong Club on Wednesday night August 31st.

A few days prior I thought a pre-flight inspection would be a good idea so checked the radio, batteries, retract undercarriage which were all okay but when I got to the engine it had no compression. The model hadn't been flown since our last annual display at Yendon on Sunday 30th March 2014.



Exhaust valve adjuster found sheared off in Magnum 91FS most likely caused by owners heavy hand. It may have flown several flights sitting just like shown in the photo.

No compression so I immediately thought the valve lifters in the 2003 model Magnum 91FS were gummed up with oil (yes it had been flown with 50/50 castor/synthetic oil). I took the rocker cover off and to my surprise and horror noticed the exhaust valve adjuster locknut sitting alongside the rocker arm. It had sheared off the adjuster screw.

The engine was running okay during the flights when last flown at our display day so fortunately the valve clearance mustn't have changed and probably more to the point the broken off nut didn't foul the rocker cover causing further damage and most likely stopping the engine.

Probably my fault for over tightening the adjuster nut so that is something to be aware off when adjusting valve clearances on four strokes. Put the 12" shifter away!!!

I was seated next to Wally & Pearl Schubach. I don't think they were aware the camera man was lurking!!! I've known Wally since joining D&DARCS in the late 1960's which later became P&DARCS when they moved to the current field at Cardinia near Pakenham.

Peter Harris entertained us by playing his organ for most of the evening. As well as a good pilot he is an accomplished organist. Peter also did a lot of work putting together a PowerPoint display of old photos to convey the history of the club. It was projected onto the back wall in continuous display mode where everyone could see it.

The next day I followed Norm out to the P&DARCS field at Cardinia and to my surprise there must have been well over a dozen members already there and others coming and going as the day progressed. Apparently if the weather is reasonable there are members there every day. The club has a webcam (actually three) which can be viewed on their web site by anyone. It means members can see if there is any activity at the field before they head out and provides a level of security. The phone line was connected to the property way back before the age of mobile phones, so the connection now enables broadband and hence the webcams.

I had the Airacobra with me; the intention being to fly it with Norm's 1972 Northerner, but the broken rocker adjuster mentioned in *Tips & Tricks* prevented me from flying it. Just had to be content with some photos instead.

However I did get to have a fly of Norm's Northerner aerobatic model designed and built by the late John McGrane which was much appreciated although a little apprehensive given its age and sentimental attachment.

They certainly have great facilities and to keep the whole show going takes a lot of work. Norm is the field manager and after a guided tour around it is no wonder the position is basically a full time job. They have a newly constructed shed with 3 car hoists to park their tractors & mowers on so they can be raised above the known flood level. They are raised every time parked back in the shed after use. I was expecting to get my car serviced when I saw it all!!! But the reality is it is necessary because flooding is inevitable and water wrecks tractors as they only know too well.



The shed is high because it houses three hoists to raise tractors & mowers above the flood level which is at least $\frac{1}{3}$ the way up the doors.
