As Vice President, Glenn White will step in and assume the President's responsibilities until the end of the financial year when a new president will be elected.







Points of interest from the last meeting

1. Roy Gladman Round 3 – Scale

Glenn White pointed out that we require three judges and that the emphasis is on the flying. The event is being held on Sunday 15th December which is the day after the Xmas Party.

2. Avalon Bus

Roger Carrigg reported that Rob Beardall advised prior to the meeting that his quote from GOLD Bus Lines was well over \$400. The meeting decided to book the Bus through Peter McMahon of Davis Bus Lines.

3. Life Member Guidelines Report

Tom Jobling reported that he is looking at three organizations in which to model our membership types. Constitution makes no reference to Life members. Expect to have it finalized within a few weeks.

4. Annual Display – March 30th 2003

Max Rowan advised that preliminary planning is in hand.

5. Site Inspection

Max Rowan reported that he has just spoken to the relevant officer at Moorabool Shire Council and was advised that all the necessary paper work has been signed off. The council does not want to inspect anything on site. An inspection will eventually need to be carried out on the toilet but this will not be required for at least 5 years. Noel Findlay and Glenn White still thought that the plumbing work will need to be inspected and signed off.

6. Xmas Party

Roger Carrigg advised the meeting that a table for 35 has been booked at the Buninyong Hotel for Saturday night 14th December commencing at 7.00PM.

7. Xmas Raffle

It was thought that we need to organize an event at one of the shopping centres ASAP to sell raffle tickets while promoting the club at the same time. Tom Jobling offered to make enquiries. The meeting thought that Friday night 6th December, at say 5.00PM to 8.00PM would be ideal.

Raffle tickets have been distributed to all members with the last newsletter.

8. Field Maintenance

Max Rowan presented the meeting with the following report and comments:

- a) Propose to site the bus shelter next to the shed on the west side.
- Propose to make the fence around the buildings more permanent and provide gate access at each end.
- c) We need to water the trees that we planted fairly frequently. There is plenty of water in the drums beside the toilet.
- d) The windsock now locates in a pipe sunk into the ground where the bus shelter used to be.
- e) It was pointed out that the rubber sheaths are coming off the starting stakes.
- f) Matt Billett stated that we need some pipes sunk into the ground that removable stakes can be located in to restrain the larger models. Need to be about 600mm apart.
- g) Rob Beardall and Max Rowan propose to make a wind meter. Max thought that it would cost about \$20. The meeting agreed that the club would cover the cost.
- h) Mower Max Rowan stated that he would like to replace both mowers with a new ride on mower. Preliminary investigations indicate that a 36" cut mower would cost around \$3000 to \$3500. Around \$600 needs to be spent on the existing mowers and unfortunately the gang mower is not really suited to the tough conditions. Westag might be interested in some limited form of sponsorship. Hope to replace mowers for around \$2000. It is important that our fundraisers are effective to enable these expensive items to be purchased.



New Models seen at field

We had two extra large models at the field on Sunday 8^{th} December to be certified by Murray Anstis.

The first model was Max's Extra 300 that he acquired at Shepparton on our recent visit. The model has a wingspan of 82 inches and is powered by a 75cc Webra petrol engine and weighs in excess of 12kg. On the first attempt to fly the Extra nosed over and broke the propeller (not a cheap item on the big models). After changing the prop another attempt was made.

As soon as the model became airborne it was obvious that Max had a handful. Model was pitching totally out of control and would not fly straight and level. After two or three attempts to turn the Extra back to the strip Max decided to chop the throttle whilst it was into wind and over the line of blue gums on south side of the field. This may have been fortunate as the trees had a cushioning effect and saved the model from major damage.

On reflection it was apparent that the Extra was too tail heavy making the elevator extremely sensitive and virtually impossible to control.

Model will soon be repaired and the C of G position will be investigated more thoroughly.

The next model on the day was Rick' 100+ inch wingspan Beaver powered by a Zenoah 38cc petrol engine. Another mammoth scale model brought back from Shepparton. Unfortunately the wind was a little strong for a test flight, however Rick ran the motor. Rick had difficulty starting it and has since invested in a starter spring. We look forward to seeing its first test flight early in the new year.

We are pleased to report that the new club trainer is now in service. It was test flown on Saturday afternoon 14th December. The trainer is a Precedent HiBoy powered by a Tiger Shark 40 and was purchased at Hamilton by the club for \$125. Model is setup for mode 1 and 2 and is ready to give prospective new members a taste of aeromodelling.
