The Secretary raised the point that although it was voted on to raise the fees at the last meeting by \$20 to settle the ongoing opposition to the Member Participation Scheme, the increase is probably excessive. After some discussion and to follow point of order Graham Waterhouse moved a motion to rescind the vote taken at the last meeting to raise the fees by \$20 and moved a second motion to raise the fees by \$10. This was seconded by Murray Anstis. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

VMAA News

- 1. New VMAA directory is expected to be sent out with the September VMAA newsletter
- 60 VMAA affiliated members have been issued with Bronze/Gold wings. Names to be published in next VMAA newsletter. (Not sure over what period of time).
- 3. P&DARCS requested a grant of \$5000 from the VMAA to assist in financing a water storage project to enable watering of their runways. Total cost of project is \$24,000 with P&DARCS to fund \$17,000 but require a further \$5000 to fund the project. The Executive moved that the VMAA make available a grant of \$2,000 and an interest free loan of \$3,000 to be paid back over a 3 year period. Any amount of the loan that is not paid back within 3 years will attract an interest rate of 5% per annum.

It's that time of year where there aren't a lot of good days to fly, especially new models. We have heard that there are a few models being built so stay tuned.



Crash Report

The only two crashes that we know of both happened on the same day, that being the day set aside for the Roy Gladman competition (27th June).

The weather conditions were not the best with a strong north wind. Rick was the first to run into problems with his Corsair. For some reason Rick lost control of the Corsair, but managed to regain control. Shortly after gaining height Rick found himself in the same predicament. This time he was unable to regain control and the Corsair spirally into the ground and was written off. Rick didn't think that it was radio problems.

Shortly after that, Glenn flew his OS120FS powered pattern ship for a test flight prior to the competition. Glenn was having trouble landing with the strong northerly over the plantation and after the third overshoot the motor failed to power up. Model stalled and hit heavily breaking the foam wing in two places. This has since been repaired.

VFSAA Scale Rally and Team Scale

Glenn and I (Roger) went down to the State field on Sunday July 18th to participate in one of the scale rallies run by the VFSAA.

The weather wasn't very promising but since we had planned to go we didn't let it deter us. As usual on trips to the State field we made the mandatory stop at Gisborne for an egg and bacon roll and a cappuccino for breakfast. It is a very pleasant drive down to the State field particularly from Bacchus Marsh to Gisborne and then Gisborne on to the state field which is a further 10-15 minutes. It takes about an hour 20 minutes all up driving time which is about the same time it takes some of the NFG (Northern Flying Group) members to get there. (NFG is the host club at the state field.)

When we arrived, quite a number of VFSAA members were already there, together with regular NFG members out for a Sunday fly. Shortly afterwards Gordon arrived with camera in hand. Fortunately Gordon brought his camera otherwise there would not be any pictures in this article.

When we got out of the car the brisk breeze was rather sobering. Everyone likes to have a go at Ballarat about the cold but I can assure you the wind chill made it extremely cold down there. The heated club house was very much appreciated along with the rest of the state field facilities which are first class. Many thanks to the NFG members for providing the catering throughout the day.

Now for the flying. Even though it was cold the conditions weren't too bad for flying however the overcast sky makes it hard to see some models. There weren't a lot of models in the air at any one time. Pilots would venture out of the club house for a quick fly and then race back inside to get warm again. It was a good chance to have a chat with the scale fliers.

Rod Mitchell had his latest creation there which is a twin engine Grumman TigerCat powered by OS 50FX's. The TigerCat was produced late in WWII and was a carrier based aircraft (had a big retractable hook at the back). As usual Rod flew the Tiger Cat very smoothly and finished the flight with a remarkably slow landing aided by the large flaps.

There must have been a dozen or more entries with 3 in the team scale event which is a new category being trialed by the VFSAA. Team scale enables a person who enjoys building more so than flying to get someone else to fly it. We hope that this category proves popular over time.

I had a couple of uneventful flights with the P39 Airacobra. Glenn managed only one flight with the Beagle. For some reason we could not get the engine to run on the second flight attempt. Glenn has been having trouble with the early model OS91FS for some time now which seems to go through plugs rather quickly. The plugs don't burn out, they just go frosty making the 91 difficult to start and rev up without cutting out.
