A bit of Nostalgia

I (Ed.) was thinking about those who are new to the hobby and go out and buy planes that are in the most part are

unsuitable to learn on. Then I thought back to what I did which wasn't much different. As a youngster I remember buying R/C magazines occasionally (like when I had the money) and came across a model called a Henchman which took my eye.

A Bing search found it was featured in *Model Airplane News December 1967* and that is where the plans and photos have come from. Before I could start building it the full size plans had to be drawn up by scaling out of the magazine. Back then it could only be built bit by bit as you got the money to buy balsa and glue and on a 1st year apprentice wage it took some doing.





Photo from Model Airplane News and found online. Mine was tissue & dope covered and painted with Humbrol Orange with white trim.

After a fair bit of it was built, I remember buying the engine, an OS MAX 60 from the Model Dockyard in Swanston Street Melbourne which cost \$52 (why do I remember that?) and they told me about a new club that flew in the Police Paddocks off Brady Road North Dandenong which turned out to be D&DARCS. At the time the OS60 at 10cc seemed huge after being accustomed to 1.5cc & 2.5cc engines in the free flight and control line models I had dabbled in.



These plans featured in the magazine so I scaled them up by redrawing on a large sheet of paper.

The next thing needed was radio gear — big bucks back in those days. The Melbourne Trading Post paper was pretty popular back then (eBay of the era) for second hand goods and I found a set of OS Minitron 12 Channel Reed gear with four or five Bonner Transmite servos for \$200. (The second hand radio was 4 times the cost of the engine.)



OS Minitron 12 Channel Reed set. How would you like to mount all this gear in your model today? Those Bonner Transmite servos were huge. A set sold on eBay in the UK in 2011 for £370. I wish I still had mine!!!

The set operated on the 27MHz band which at the time was the only frequency band allocated to R/C models in Australia. It must have had one *trim* servo for the throttle and three *neutralizing* for rudder, elevator & ailerons. Reeds used one channel per direction so each control required 2 channels hence the model used 8 channels of the 12 available. You could hear the reeds vibrating when control was input and the twelve channels all had a different sound – in fact you could open up the receiver and tune the reeds to the channel which needed to be done occasionally. To get elevator trim it required another servo and 2 channels, the output was connected to the sliding tray in which the elevator servo was mounted. I can't remember if the Henchman had that or not but

something tells me it used 10 channels so it probably did have the elevator trim servo.

An OS Minitron 12 channel transmitter which dates back to at least the early 1960's. A far cry from today's computerized sets.



These were the Bonner Transmite servos that came as either trim or neutralizing types. Throttle used trim type while control surfaces used the neutralizing type.

The Henchman was built before I had my driver's licence so my parents took me out to the Police paddocks in Brady Road North Dandenong I guess one weekend early 1968 where there were a number of guys flying R/C models of which I was in total awe. (The rectangle where we flew is still there today and used as a sports field.) After introducing myself it turned out there was one chap Keith Follett who could fly reed gear. With reeds you had to pulse the switch lever to achieve the proportional effect at the control surface. Anyway I got the Henchman out of the

car and assembled it, filled the tank & started the engine while Keith went through the basic checks.

The orange Henchman with white trim was taken out to the square take-off/landing area. Keith stood behind it, opened the throttle and the Henchman zoomed down the strip and lifted into the air in what looked like a near perfect take-off. He flew it around for a little while then brought it in for a perfect landing. After that I remember him saying words to the effect "well you'd better put that away and get something you can learn to fly on".



This is exactly what mine looked like way back in 1968. Same colour scheme which was on the box the kit came in. Can't remember exactly what happened to it in the end.


After joining the club (D&DARCS) I then built a Graupner Taxi 3 channel kit and fitted an OS19 and flew that using the OS reed gear until I could afford a set of Kraft proportional.



The wings and tail assembly (vertical & horizontal stabilizer) were both held on by rubber bands which allowed for the inevitable mishaps while learning. It was cleverly designed with the wooden engine bearers protruding externally for extra strength without bulking up the fuselage cross section.

After mastering the Kraft proportional on the Graupner Taxi, I ventured back to the Henchman probably late 1968. To fly another model meant swapping the gear from one model to another. The radio was so expensive which

prohibited multiple flight packs. I flew the Henchman for a while and remember selling it to Dick Steele a hobby dealer in Croydon to buy other gear I guess around 1970.



The Graupner Taxi came out in 1966 and was a 60" rudder/elevator trainer – sport aircraft suitable for entry level builders and fliers. The original Graupner kit I bought had balsa 3 ply for the formers and fuselage sides making a very strong light weight model. The plans shown accompanied Graupner's Taxi kit and are detailed enough to recreate the aircraft quite nicely. The photos displayed are from http://www.outerzone.co.uk/plan details.asp?ID=719

I suppose all of us who go back to this era would have a story about how they got started. You didn't just walk into a shop and buy a plane that was ready to fly – you had to build it first. Today genuine radio equipment failure is extremely remote and most times can be attributed to the way it has been handled but back then you were pleased when it worked without a glitch.

Taxiing back after landing.

There were a few others there who also took advantage of the time to setup their models and have a practice flight. There is plenty of undercover lockable space at the Shepparton field to leave models overnight which saves a lot of time & effort when events run over multiple days.
